



Upper level (entrance)



Nagasaki National Peace Memorial Hall for the Atomic Bomb Victims is a facility for mourning victims of the bombing and commemorating peace.

You will find portraits of the deceased and personal memoirs here, as well as other materials related to peace.





Time required: about (30) min.

Proceed along the suggested route from the Information Desk on Level 2 (B2). In the Remembrance Hall you may mourn the atomic bomb victims and pray for peace. In the Library and the Peace Information Corner, you may obtain further information related to peace.



3 Remembrance Hall

This is the place to mourn all those who perished in the atomic bombings and pray for everlasting

On the registry shelf at the front, a list of names of atomic bomb victims is kept. When standing in front of the shelf you will be facing the hypocenter of the atomic bombing.



Relax your mind here before entering the Remembrance Hall.



Search through the various materials stored in personal computers, including portraits of the deceased, personal memoirs, and audio-visual testimonials

The atomic bomb that exploded over Nagasaki at 11:02 a.m. on August 9, 1945 instantaneously reduced the city to ruins and took many precious lives. Even the people who managed to survive were left with indelible mental and physical scars and with disorders due to radiation. We recognize the gravity of these sacrifices and hardships and offer heartfelt tribute to the memory of the deceased. We vow to convey the reality of the atomic bomb damages to people both in Japan and abroad, to inform future generations, to learn from history and to build a peaceful world free from nuclear weapons.



On the upper level of the facility is a sculpted basin which holds the water that the atomic bomb victims so desperately desired.
At night, about 70,000 optical fibers light up in mourning.



···Take a streetcar (route 1 or 3) for Akasako and get off at Atomic Bomb Museum stop; from there the Hall is about 4 minutes on foot.
-Take a bus for Nameshi, Togitsu or Menoto, and get off at Hamaguchimachi stop, from there the Hall is about 4 minutes on foot.

[From Nagasaki Airport] ···Take a limousine bus for Nagasaki Station and get off at Matsuyama machi stop; from there the Hall is about 5 minutes on foot.
