

The atomic bomb that exploded over Nagasaki at 11:02 a.m. on August 9, 1945, instantly reduced the city to ruins and took many precious lives. Those who managed to survive were left with indelible mental and physical scars and with disorders due to radiation. We recognize the gravity of these sacrifices and hardships, and offer heartfelt tribute to the memory of the deceased. We vow to convey the reality of the atomic bomb damages to people both in Japan and abroad, to inform future generations, to learn from history and to build a peaceful world free from nuclear weapons.
